





Hay & Wool Show

HAY

Iron County is the second largest hay producing county in the state of Utah with over 38 million dollars' worth of annual sales. It is only appropriate that the county fair judge and exhibit this important commodity to the public during the fair.

Any Iron County hay producer is eligible to enter hay produced in the 2022 or 2022 production year. There are three divisions that a producer may enter an exhibit, alfalfa hay with three classes (1st, 2nd, 3rd or 4th cutting), grass hay with one class and mixed hay with one class. Only one entry per family operation per class.

Division I - Alfalfa Hay:

- Class 1 First cutting
- Class 2 Second cutting
- Class 3 Third/fourth cutting

Division II- Grass Hay:

• Class 4 - 100 % grass any cutting

Division III - Mixed Hay:

• Class 5 - Any percentage of alfalfa and grass mixed

Delivery of Entries — Entries need to be delivered to the Iron County Extension office by Wednesday August 16, 2023 5:00 PM. Enter one, two or three twined bale per class. A core sample will be taken and sent to a laboratory for NIRS analysis free of charge. The analysis will be used as well as visual appraisal to place each class. Entries will become the property of USU Extension and will be taken to and from the county fairgrounds. Entries will automatically be entered in the inaugural state hay show at the Utah State Fair.

Awards sponsored by Staheli West - Each class winner will be awarded \$50.00 and the overall champion hay entry will be awarded \$100.00

WOOL

Iron county is the third largest sheep and goat producing county in the state of Utah with over 8 million dollars' worth of annual sales. One of the important products that comes from this industry is wool and mohair. It is only appropriate that the county fair judge and exhibit this important commodity to the public during the fair.

Any Iron County sheep producer is eligible to enter wool produced from the 2023 production year. There are two divisions that a producer may enter an exhibit, ram fleece or ewe fleece. Classes will be divided by microns after the fleece has been sent to a laboratory for analysis.

Delivery of Entries - Entries need to be delivered to the Iron County Extension office by Friday August 18, 2023 5:00 PM. Enter as many fleeces as you would like. A sample will be taken and sent

He also worked in the movie and television industry training big cats, elephants, primates, sea mammals and raptors. Martin Tyner is a federally licensed falconer, eagle falconer, wildlife rehabilitator, wildlife propagator, and wildlife and environmental educator. TRACTOR PULL

Returning for the 2023 Iron County Fair is the Antique Tractor Pull, held at the Iron County Fair Grandstand. This event has evolved over time as farmers try to prove who has the toughest tractor. Originally two tractors would hook drawbar-to-drawbar and stage a tug-of-war. Today, a transfer sled is utilized. This weighted sled transfers more weight from the sled to the tractor the further it travels down the track, until the tractor is stopped by the load. The longest pull in each tractor weight class is declared the winner. Tractors will compete against other tractors of similar weight. The weight classes for tractors range from 1,500 lbs to over 10,000 lbs. The Antique Tractor Pull is open to all two wheel drive tractors manufactured in 1969 or before.

- 3 mph Farm Stock (for antique tractors made before 1960)
- 4.5 mph Farm Stock Plus (for all antique and classic tractors made prior to 1970)
