

Welcome Power Wheels Drivers and Pit Crew!

There is a designated area in the front of the arena nearest the grand stands with a banner that says "Power Wheels Parking" to put all power wheel vehicles before the event starts.

Please make sure your child's power wheels is in this designated area and your driver is checked in before 6PM.

We will have a meeting near the power wheels parking area at 6:30PM all drivers and pit crew need to attend this meeting. (There will be prizes handed out for drivers at this meeting)

All Power wheels drivers and their pit crew needs to sit in the grand stands until the event is called.

The Power Wheels event is going to be held directly after the National Anthem. They will race in the front of the racetrack closest to the grand stands.

Power Wheels derby-

This year each child will need to make 15 hits, the first child to achieve this will be first, the second child will be 2nd place and so on.

There will be a trophy for 1st – 3rd place winners.

Each driver will be assigned a professional derby driver or volunteer along with 1 parent or guardian. This volunteer is strictly assigned to count the number of hits for your driver so that you can take pictures and enjoy the event.

Please review the rules to make sure your driver has everything they need, and the power wheels vehicle meets the safety guidelines.

The most important part of today is to make sure the children have fun and that they stay safe.

“Power Wheels” Demolition Derby Rules

To ensure the safety of all our drivers involved the following rules need to be met by the children and the vehicles they will be driving:

This is supposed to be fun for the kids, parents.

Any child ages 3 to 7 years old with a Power Wheel can participate in the “Power Wheels” Derby.

They must wear approved safety helmets. Bicycle helmet is fine.

You may add a rubber tire to the tread area of the power wheel’s tire for added traction.

Power wheels may be decorated to look like a demo derby car, but may NOT be re-enforced.

No metal bumpers.

All drivers must have leg protection.

All children must be signed in with a parent at the pit gates.

One parent will be allowed on the track with their child during the event.

This even is created for our new generations to keep this amazing sport of demolition derby alive.
